



Fair Camping Rules & Regulations

By purchasing a campsite, you agree to indemnify, save harmless and defend and release Clackamas County Event Center, Clackamas County, Clackamas County Board of Commissioners, Clackamas County Fair Board, their employees and agents from and against all claims and actions, and all expenses incidental to the investigation and defense thereof, arising out of or in any way based upon damage or injury to persons or property caused by errors, omissions, fault or negligence of the camper's agents or employees or in any other manner arising out of the operation of this permit.

CAMPGROUND RULES AND REGULATIONS

Fair camping is dry camping only. There are no hook-ups for power, water, or sewer in the campground. Please contact the Fair Office if you have a medical condition requiring special camping assistance.

No refunds will be given for cancellations after August 6, 2023

1. Please ensure you bring with you your PRINTED ticket (camping permit), it will show the space you selected on the ticket. This should be displayed in your RV Window.
2. The Camping Coordinator has the authority to have vehicles towed and request the removal of disruptive or unruly campers.
3. Admissions passes to the Fair will be required and are not included in the fee for camping space(s).
4. Campers may move in beginning Sunday August 13th from 1:00pm to 6:00pm and on Monday, August 14th from 9:00am to 9:00pm. Those camping in row A MUST arrive on Sunday 8/13 to ensure they can get access to their space, late arrivals after the 13th may be turned away with no refund.
5. All vehicles and RVs must display the campground permit provided. Vehicles without permits will be towed at the owner's expense.
6. Campground speed limit is 5 mph. This is strictly enforced. Fire lanes must be kept open at all times. Vehicles blocking fire lanes will be towed at the owner's expense.

7. Persons under the age of 18 will not be allowed to camp independently. An adult (age 21 or older) must be at the campsite when children are present.
8. All youth under the age 18 must remain in a campsite with Adult (age 21 or older) supervision after 9pm. All youth must be in their own campsite by 11pm.
9. Your permit allows for 1 campsite and 1 vehicle parking permit. Your camper and vehicle MUST FIT within your assigned space. Including awnings and tip outs.
10. For vehicles that do not fit within the camping space boundaries, limited additional parking is available in the Campground Overflow parking lot. See Campground Coordinator for space assignment in the overflow parking lot. Parking passes for general parking can be purchased at the Fair Will Call window for all other vehicles.
11. Hay and Straw cannot be stored in the campground due to Fire Marshall Regulations.
12. Courteous respect for other campers is expected. Quiet time is from one hour after Fair closing until 7:00am. The Fair closes at 11:00pm on Friday and Saturday and 10:00pm all other days. Generators must be turned off by 11:00pm.
13. The following are NOT allowed in the campground and on the entire grounds at any time:
 - ✓ Alcohol
 - ✓ Smoking or Vaping of any kind
 - ✓ Pets
 - ✓ Open Fires
 - ✓ Wastewater dumping (no dumping gray water on ground or containers)
 - ✓ No one in barns after 10:00 PM
14. Propane/Pellet BBQ's have been approved by the Fire Marshall, so you may cook with them.
15. A sanitary service will be on site to empty holding tanks (there is a fee). Contact the Camp Coordinator to make arrangements.*
16. All Campsites must be vacated within 24 hours of the close of the Fair. Anything left more than 24 hours will be removed and the registered occupant will be charged for removal.

Violators of these rules will be immediately expelled from the campground, and the fairgrounds with their animals, and forfeit all prizes and premium money. Parents, adult supervisors, or other non-exhibitors who are associated with a youth livestock exhibitor staying in the campground, that violates these rules, will cause the youth they are responsible for, or

associated with, to also be immediately expelled from the campground and the fair, and forfeit all prizes and premium money. Expulsion will be a joint decision between the camping coordinator and the fair executive director. Violators will be escorted by security personnel as they collect their animals and move off site. All camping identification will be surrendered. Items that cannot be hand-carried from the campsite, such as a camping vehicle, must be retrieved on the Monday after fair. Any additional expenses resulting from the expulsion will be borne by the violator. There are no warnings or second chances, no exceptions.

CAMPGROUND FEES: RV and vehicle **MUST** fit within boundaries of assigned campsite. Vehicles that cannot fit within campsite boundaries must park in the campground overflow parking lot.

Note: Should a shortage of camping space occur, consideration will be given to those traveling the furthest.
