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*ENTER IN ONLY **ONE** AGE GROUP, except Adults with less than 2 years experience in a skill may enter that skill in Teen/Beginner. Any person not entering in the proper age group will be disqualified.*

**Entry Fees:** There are no entry fees for this department.

We can easily delete items that are not completed or ready at time of entry.**

**Items Accepted:**

- 1. Entered items accepted Friday, **August 7<sup>th</sup>, 2026** from 1:00 PM to 7:00 PM in the Hobby Hall Department.
  - 2. Entered items accepted Saturday, **August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026** from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM in the Hobby Hall Department.
- No Items will be accepted after 4:00 PM Saturday.**

**Exhibitors with more than 20 entries are requested to be on site and in the department a minimum of 1 hour before exhibit intake cutoff so that you can complete the intake process by 7:00 p.m. Friday or 4 p.m. on Saturday – NO EXCEPTIONS.**

**Release Times:**

- 1. Sunday, **August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2026** from **12:00 PM to 5:00 PM**. Entries will be checked out in the Hobby Hall Department. **No entries will be released before 12:00 PM.**
- 2. Premiums will be withheld and the privilege of showings at future fairs jeopardized by anyone attempting to remove entries prior to 12:00 PM Sunday!
- 3. **NO entries will be returned without your claim ticket present. NO Exceptions!!**

**Special Contest for 2026:**

**Patriotic Apron Contest in honor of 250 Years of the United States of America**  
All patriotic apron entries in Divisions 800, 810 and 820 will be considered for this award.

**All Divisions will be considered for “Best” Awards. Divisions are:**

## Departments:

**Division 800:** Junior= 12 years old and under

**Division 810:** Teen & Beginner Textiles (13-17 or Adults with under with 2 years experience in the skill)

**Division 820:** Adult (18 years old and up with at least 2 or more years of experience in the skill)

The Senior Division has been combined with the Adult Division to comply with the request to align our exhibitor handbook with the Oregon State Fair handbook, so the same computer software can be used.

## Textile Departmen Specific Rules:

1. Limit of (1) one entry per class, per exhibitor.
2. Exhibits, which are entered in the “wrong division”, will be reclassified at the discretion of the Superintendent.
3. Entries must stay the length of the fair.
4. Judges will award first, second and third place ribbons according to merit.
5. Please make sure you fill out the description of your entry on the entry form.
6. **All entries must be clean!** No cigarette smell and no pet hair.
7. All entries must be the handiwork of the exhibitor.
8. It is necessary to pre-enter entries. No paper forms accepted.
9. All entries completed within the last two years will be shown preference. Any article more than five years old will be barred from showing except with permission from the superintendent.
10. Articles entered for premiums must be completed projects. No article will be eligible for a premium if it has received a prize in previous years at the Clackamas County Fair.
11. Items will be disqualified if they have a price tag or obvious signs of being store bought.
12. Sets must be pinned together or attached by other means to avoid separation.
13. All reasonable care will be exercised to safeguard entries. Clackamas County Fair will not be responsible for loss of or damage to any entry.
14. All classes are judged on the American System. Only one (1) 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> will be awarded per class.
15. No premium will be awarded just because there are no other entries in the class. If the article is not deemed worthy of a 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbon, it may be awarded a lesser premium.
16. A champion ribbon will be awarded in Junior, Teen & Beginner and in each division grouping of Adult Textiles.
17. A rosette ribbon will be awarded for the Best Textile and Reserve Best Textile.
18. A rosette ribbon will be awarded for the Queen/King of Textiles and Runner Up based on points earned.
19. In determining special awards for most points earned, the following applies: blue 5 points, red 3 points, white 1 point. In the case of a tie, the winner with the most blue ribbons shall be the winner.
20. In the case of Best Textile winners and Queen/King of Textiles and Runner Up, the winner must be a Clackamas County resident, and an exhibitor cannot win the same award more than 2 consecutive years.
21. All Division will be considered “Best” Awards.
22. Fair Theme items will also be considered for Patriotic Awards in 2026 only.
23. Submission of entry implies the exhibitor's acceptance of the rules.

## **Division 800: Junior Textiles (12 Years old and under)**

### Class Numbers:

1. Any small sewn item (scrunchie, doll clothes, sachet, etc.)
2. Any sewn item (pillow, pillowcase, clothing, apron, etc.)
3. Braiding/knotting (friendship bracelet, coaster, doll house braided rug, etc.)

## **Division 810: Teen & Beginner Textiles (13-17 or Adult with under 2 years experience)**

### Class Numbers:

3. Crocheted Item
4. Felted Item (wet or needle felt)
5. Hand Dyed (fiber, yarn, or item such as T-shirt)
6. Handspun Yarn (one skein of 25 yards)
7. Handspun Yarn article (Knit, crocheted, woven, etc.)
8. Knitted Item
9. Stitchery Item (embroidery, cross stitch, crewel, etc.)
10. Weaving, any item
11. Other than Classified (Describe on entry form)

**Adult & Senior Divisions have been combined. Open to anyone 18 years old and older with 2 years of experience in the skill.**

Attach a 3x5 card with each entry and include breed of sheep or animal if know, fiber prepared and dyed by exhibitor or commercially processed and a small fiber sample. **For Classes 62- 64:** All yarn skeins must be a minimum of 25 yards or 1 ounce, maximum of 4 ounces and tied in at least 3 places using figure 8 style self-ties. **For Classes 65- 66:** Include type and amount of fiber used, technique used and a 12" sample of all yarns used in final structure. **For Class 67:** See above instruction appropriate for item submitted.

- 61. Display of hand-dyed fiber or yarn: include method, dye, and mordant used
- 62. Hand-spun yarn, single strand skein
- 63. Hand-spun yarn, 2 ply skein
- 64. Hand-spun yarn 3 ply skein
- 65. Hand-spun yarn article, non-wearable
- 66. Hand-spun yarn article, wearable
- 67. Other than classified (Describe on entry form)

### **Class numbers for Handwoven:**

Attach a 3x5 card with each entry. Include type and sample of fiber &/or yarn, Sett (EPI & PPI) and any other pertinent information.
